Branch of the national government (USDI):

- ✓ Administers and enforces CITES (Cites authority)
- ✓ USFWS administers and enforces the U.S. Endangered species act.

United States Endangered Species Act

- A national law, that has international provisions.
- ✓ Allows for listing of wildlife world wide.
- Authorizes USFWS international law enforcement powers on US citizens and US residents hunting overseas.

United States Endangered Species Act

- A national law, that has international provisions.
- Listing of a species is based on evaluation of the "best scientific data available"
- Species are either listed as "Threatened" or "Endangered".

United States Endangered Species Act

- A national law, that has international provisions.
- ✓ "Endangered" No legal hunting. (by US citizens)
- "Threatened" Maybe hunting under certain circumstances.

United States Endangered Species Act

 Species may be placed on the list, down listed, up listed, or removed.



- ✓ USFWS reviews "best scientific data available"
- Proposed decisions by USFWS are advertised for a public review period on the Federal Register.
- Before a final decision USFWS answers all posed questions.

United States Endangered Species Act

Selected provisions of ESA:

- \checkmark The act requires recovery plans.
- Requires a monitoring system for candidate species.
- \checkmark USFWS also has emergency listing powers.

USFWS international law enforcement powers?

- ✓ While the ESA or US CITES decisions only apply to US citizens or residents, USFWS can control what US hunters are allowed to do.
- ✓ USFWS supports managed hunting as a tool for conservation, it does not want US citizens contributing to the problem.

NA hunters make up a significant portion of the market for wild sheep and goats:

- \checkmark Wild sheep species are the most popular to US hunters.
- \checkmark However, a significant number also hunt lbex and Markhor.

i.e. For Torghar from 1986-2006 62% of urial, 20 % markhor harvested by NA hunters. (US citizens were not allowed to import markhor)

What does all this have to do with Tajikistan?
