


What is Weather?






Weather change: There are colder and warmer days, which is the norm, if the averages in long run do not change






What is Climate?






Climate change:

There are colder and warmer years, which is the norm if the averages in the long-term period do not change.









Why is climate change happening?

Effects of climate change in Tajikistan

- Higher temperatures
- Changes in Rain patterns
- Glaciers are melting
- Less snow in winter \rightarrow Decrease in melt water
- Change in humidity level
- Changes in wind speed






Role and function of the forest

- Apart form the economic benefits (firewood and non timber forest products), forest provide the following functions:
- Reduction and Prevention of soil erosion
- Prevention of mudflows
- Prevention of shore washout and flood protection
- Moisture retention in soil \rightarrow Improvement of productivity of arable land
- Nutrient cycling and soil formation
- Climate regulation
- Provision of fresh air




Impact of climate change on forest

- Loss of biodiversity
- Spread of diseases and pests
- Decrease in productivity
- Disappearance and extinction of species
- Decrease in habitat for forest species
- Degradation of forests due to less water
